

A moderate length hole that plays on a narrow fairway cut through the forest. The tee shot is the key to success as the hole plays back up to the plateau with a large pine guarding the right.



The first and shortest of the par 3's. A stately maple tree guards the left side of the hole and an expansive bunker guards the right side of the green.

> The first of two par 5's on the front-side with no fairway bunkers to influence long drives. The second shot plays from a plateau looking down into a well guarded landing zone. Keep the second shot straight to avoid bunkers and heavy forest on the right.

The longest and perhaps the most impressive par 4 hole on the course. The fairway is layered into the hill and is guarded on the right by a long bunker that runs nearly the entire length of the hole right into the edge of the green.

reach the green in two.

An uphill par 3 playing one club longer than the yardage on the scorecard. The tee is the largest on the course and provides a huge area for various tee settings and angles.



A finesse hole that does not require a long tee shot. The driving zone is tight and guarded by bunkers on the right. The entrance to the green is protected by a large maple on the left and a deep bunker on the right.

A comfortable front-side finishing hole that plays a slight dogleg right. Two bunkers guard the left side of the driving zone with mature trees and OB on the right. The green has a bunker located at front center requiring shots tocarry onto the putting surface.

Another slight dogleg to the right with a generous driving zone that is the high point of the hole. A large bunker guards the left side of the green and a deep grass swale guards the right front.

> The longest par 3 on the course. The green is nestled in the trees and has a large bunker on the let The terrain is level and will play longer than it reads.



The second longest part 4 on the back side that plays up to a plateau where the green is located. There are no bunkers around the greens so it invites golfers to be bold on the second shot.

> he longest par 4 plays down to the largest green on the course. The green is surrounded by water on the right and back.

A great vista from the tee allows views of several back nine holes. The drive lands past the plateau providing extra distance leaving a mid-iron to the green. Watch the OB along the right.

> A tricky driving hole with a single large bunker located in the center of the fairway. Pick the fairway target to the left, right or short to leave a safe second shot. The green has three distinct levels.

The first of two spectacular par 5's on this side. The second shot areas are large and present several options to play around or short of a large lake. Big rewards for a bold second shot that plays directly at the green

> The most scenic par 3 on the course The tees are located 50 feet above the green. The golfers look past the large green to the lake stretching behind and around the green.

The golf course's signature par 5. The tees are high and the drive must carry a corner of the lake to a double wide fairway. The hole narrows in the second shot area which is located 30 feet above the fairway.
